



ARTISTIC REPORT

In 2024, Snuff Puppets presented 87 live performances reaching over 74,000 audience members, ran six workshops with 119 participants and over 15.5 million watched our online viral videos.

This year, we strengthened our connections with communities, particularly in Southeast Arnhem Land and Melbourne. The People's Puppet Project in Numbulwar, in collaboration with Numbulwar Numburindi Arts, allowed us to create giant puppets alongside local children and elders, sharing traditional Wubuy stories and fostering joy within the community.

Our Snuff Skools provided valuable training opportunities, with participants from the North Australian Festival of Arts and VCA Secondary School exploring puppetry and showcasing their skills in performances.

Collaboration with community groups in Melbourne's West —celebrated cultural heritage while addressing contemporary

issues, resulting in huge performance at the Be Bold Festival.

The Find Your Voice Collective in Warrnambool created giant puppets to enhance their choir performances, emphasizing inclusivity and community spirit.

We presented 15 roaming gigs, including tours to the Sydney Festival and Darwin Festival. And we continued our exploration of short filmmaking, experimenting with green screen techniques.

We thank our artists, board, staff, funders, gig partners, Crumpler and Snuff Lovers for their support.

After 33 years we continue to expand our creativity and cultural storytelling, enriching the lives of participants and audiences.

Snuff Puppets is a community of Naarm-based artists dedicated to the art and theatre of puppetry.

Since 1992, Snuff Puppets has been unleashing giant puppet spectacles worldwide.

Our work is a collision of sculpture, music and physical theatre.

From our home in the Footscray
Drill Hall our artists and works have
travelled to festivals in
over 30 countries.

Our community

workshops have created 40 new works.


We love performing for free with nontraditional arts audiences; reclaiming streets and public spaces for art.

We create giant shows, outdoor roaming acts, community workshops, installations and viral videos.

Snuff Puppets are deliberately anarchic, and rebellious. Our work tackles important, awkward and taboo topics.

We blur the traditional lines between audience and performer; creating other worlds that are unfamiliar, and sometimes uncomfortable and scary.

Snuff Puppets' experimental, handmade and joyful work celebrates the creativity in everybody.

WORKSHOP

NUMBURINDI NT PPP

Snuff Puppets were invited by Numbulwar Numburindi Arts in Southeast Arnhem Land, NT, to run a two-week People's Puppet Project at the Numbulwar School.

Together with elders from the arts centre and youngsters from the school, the team made a giant Brolga and Emu, and a gang of Baby Emus for the kids to perform.

GIANT PUPPETS OF THE WEST



Snuff Puppets reconnected with three local community groups who've made work with us in recent years, representing local Pacific Islander, East African and Vietnamese communities in Melbourne's West: Australian Vietnamese Arts and Culture, East African Womans Foundation, and Australia Pacific Arts Network / Pacific Island Creative Arts Australia.

Giant Puppets of the West is revisiting the puppets as cultural assets for these groups, training new young people in performance and production, and pursuing new proffessional opportunities.

In pulling the groups together, sprucing up the puppets and collaboratively developing the works into their next phase, we are building on the strength of previous work, developing skills in giant puppetry into the future, and bringing important cultural stories to a broader audience.

All three groups performed together at Be Bold Festival 2024 in St Albans.

EAST AFRICAN WOMEN'S FOUNDATION

East African Women's Foundation show Deghdeer is a classic Somali folktale told through giant puppets, and was made by youth and elders of Melbourne's Western suburbs Somali community during a 2022 People's Puppet Project workshop.

It features Deghdeer (a witch) Arawheela (a mother), a Camel, a Goat and a Magic Cooking-Pot.

In 2024, in addition to the Be Bold Festival, *Deghdeer* was performed by young puppeteers at Melbourne University's African Culture on Campus Day.









WORKSHOP

FIND YOUR VOICE

Warrnambool's Find Your Voice Collective created 12 giant puppets as part of a People's Puppet Project.

Participants designed and built 12 animal-themed puppets mounted on a mix of backpack and wheelchair frames, including an Octo-Pig, Rainbow-Eagle, Elephant, and Vampire-Wolf.

A giant trumpet puppet was also created, based on their Reg Mombassa-designed company logo.

The Find Your Voice all-abilities choir made the puppets to augment their impressive performances of up to 250 singers, beginning with the 2025 Port Fairy Folk Festival and leading towards a 2026 collaboration with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra.

SNUFF SKOOLS

Snuff Skool continues to be a valuable space for participants to explore large-scale puppetry, develop performance skills, and connect with the arts community.

In 2024 we conducted two Snuff Skools...

North Australian Festival of Arts hosted a Snuff Skool in Townsville, as part of our run at the festival. Participants finished the session with a roaming performance at the festival opening.

38 theatre students from VCA Secondary School spent half a day in our Drill Hall exploring the possibilities of our puppets with support from the Snuff Puppets team.

PUNCH AGENCY


International projects continued to develop, with our German collaborator Stefanie Oberhoff inviting us to a creative development residency at Konvent Zero in Catalunya, with a presentation at Festival Kontrast, Cal Rosal, titled "Punch Agency Office for Practical Joke and Flying Lie!".

Our small team led local artists in the construction of two Fly puppets and began tests in puppet climbing, rappel and zip-line techniques, to inform development of a new major work - Kaspar Kills Flies, to be premiered at the 24th International Puppet Theatre Festival in Erlangen, Germany in 2025.



Molonglo, a sustainable property development in Canberra, featured our giant puppets for an online marketing campaign.




WORKSHOP

A team of eight Snuff Puppets and international artists from Japan and America undertook a six-week research & development project in Tokyo.

Our brief was to investigate how to make spectacular entertainment experiences for tens of thousands of audiences for popular music and cultural events.

The intensive project allowed Snuff Puppets to explore further our work with crane suspended puppetry and designed a massive bird with a 40 metre wingspan.

We also delved into designing and prototyping habitable cavernous spaces using our methodology of organically designed inflatable technology.

Snuff Puppets art continued to reach MILLIONS of people online in 2024.

We produced a short video, <u>Baby Milk</u>, experimenting with multiple green screen layers.

Instagram followers grew by 33% in 2024, from 20,300 to 27,000

In 2024, the *snuffpuppets.com* website attracted 16,000 active users, marking an increase from 11,000 in 2023. The top three countries were Australia (6,000 users), the USA (3,400), and China (1,400).
